Linda studied photography under Bill Hendricks at Ventura College and continues to attend photography workshops and seminars each year to further her knowledge of the craft. She is also a member of the Ventura Beach Chapter of BNI, the Professional Photographers of America (PPA), Professional Photographers of California (PPC) and its local affiliate organization Channel Islands Professional Photographer's Association (CIPPA).
